Dumpsters Are For Residential Trash ONLY

Do not dispose of furniture, mattresses, tires, construction debris, appliances, lawn furniture, etc. in trash containers. Do not place on the ground by dumpsters!

Here's where you can take these items:

Westside Landfill: 269-279-5444

Furniture, water heaters, mattresses, & construction, demo, & remodeling waste.

Hazardous Waste Collection:

Oct. 17 8am - noon @ Cnty Fairgrounds:

Appliances, tires, paint, pesticides, fertilizer, chemicals, TV's, monitors, other electronics. Air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers (fee). Use M-86 entrance.

Quarterly Styrofoam Recycling:

Sept 12 & Dec. 12 from 7:30—11:30am

Westside Landfill. Take-out boxes, meat/fish trays, egg cartons, packing peanuts, foam cups & plates.

Resort Scrap Metal Recycling:

File in SW corner of resort equipment lot. Aluminum, steel, galvanized pipe, sheet metal, & iron. Washers, dryers, stoves. Grills (with ashes/coins removed). Remove all non-metallic components. No glass, no refrigerants, no propane tanks, no water heaters.

Other options:

Tires and auto batteries: exchange for new ones at your retailer or shop.

Oil and antifreeze: Ask at your auto shop.

TV's / monitors: Take to Best Buy or other retailers who recycle electronics (fee).

Rechargeable batteries: take to battery store or county waste collection.

Proper waste disposal is a lot of work. It's just not possible for the resort to do it for 250 families!

The only realistic system is for each of us to be responsible for our own "stuff."

If you see the "Friends at Klines Resort" Facebook page, you may have seen pictures of my occasional "fishing" catch. No, not real fish. But these fish sometimes stink just as much. I'm talking, of course, about our mixed recycling and cardboard recycling containers and the many items incorrectly placed there.

We've tried to communicate in so many ways that the only excuse left is that you are willfully ignoring the rules. It's silly for resort staff to spend time cleaning up others' mess. So we have a new policy. If you put items in trash or recycling without following the rules, **we will bill you for our time looking at security cameras and retrieving your trash. Minimum charge \$20.**

I just sent out my first bill for boxes containing tv cables, plastic wrappers and a big plastic floor mat. Thanks for leaving your billing info inside the box. It made you an easy catch.

Biggest offenders are plastic bags and other plastic wrappers. 2nd place goes to boxes that are not broken down or that contain plastic or foam materials inside. Each day has a new discovery. A lid to a plastic storage box. Solar lights! Light bulbs and batteries. Hangers, hoses, wire and cables. Food-soiled cans & pizza boxes.

Please read the column at left for places to take some hard to dispose of items. None of these belong in our mixed recycling.

Thanks to all of you who try so hard to do it right. If in doubt, leave it out. I'm happy to help you figure it out.

Storage Area Reminders

Fall brings lots of activity to the storage lot.

Please follow these rules:

1. **Storage lot hours 7 am to 9 pm.** No access after hours.
2. **Use only your assigned spot.** Only the office can assign a spot! No swapping or trading. If unsure of your number, call office.
3. Back squarely into space. **Center boat on # attached to fence.**
4. **Put your lot number** on trailer tongue where visible.
5. Don't overload your space. **8' wide limit!** Your neighbors need room to get in and out! **No freestanding shelters are allowed.**
6. **Improperly parked units may be moved and impounded.**
7. If someone is in your spot, **don't take another's spot.** Park in office lot until we can sort things out.
8. **Share the pontoon trailer!** 1 hour limit weekends. Report problems to office. **Trailer may not leave the resort at any time!**
9. **License plates & boat tags** must be current.
10. **Tarps don't work!** Use shrink wrap or a custom fitting cover.
11. **Annual storage lot fees** are billed in October.

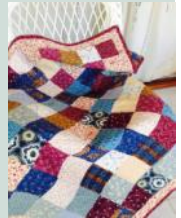
